Press Release: 2nd India–Mexico High Tech Forum 2025 successfully held in Mexico City

Mexico City, October 30, 2025

The Embassy of India in Mexico, in association with the Trade & Commerce Council of India and Mexico (INDMEX), successfully organized the 2nd edition of the India–Mexico High Tech Forum on 30 October 2025 at Club Naval, Mexico City. This premier bilateral technology and innovation forum highlighted the growing importance of India–Mexico collaboration in high-tech, digital innovation, and knowledge exchange. More than 250 attendees from 180 Tech & IT companies participated in the event.

2. Building on the success of the first edition of the High Tech Forum held in October 2023, the second edition convened key stakeholders from government, industry, and academia to discuss emerging technologies and strategies for digital transformation with the aim of further deepening bilateral cooperation in science, technology, and innovation. The event underscored the shared vision for an innovation-driven partnership between India and Mexico, translating the high-level intent of Leaders of both the countries into concrete collaborations in the digital domain.

3. The forum was inaugurated by key government dignitaries from Mexico who underscored the significance of the growing technological partnership between India and Mexico. During the inaugural plenary session, Ambassador Pankaj Sharma, highlighted the forum as “a timely platform to transform the shared vision of our leaders into tangible cooperation.” He noted that India and Mexico are natural partners in technology and innovation, and emphasized that this forum will “build new bridges of innovation between our two countries,” fostering an ecosystem of collaboration and trust.

4. H.E. Mr. Alejandro Murat, President of the Commission on Foreign Affairs, Mexican Senate, underlined the importance of financial inclusion. He said that the Forum was timely and provided a great opportunity for India and Mexico to collaborate, including in the context of Plan Mexico. He also praised India’s prowess in the area of Information Technology as well as the leadership by Indians in this field.

5. H.E. Dr. Juan Díaz de León Santiago, Vice Minister, Ministry of Science, Humanities, Technology and Innovation of Mexico, emphasized Mexico’s commitment to advancing innovation and learning from global best practices. He praised India’s digital public infrastructure and suggested that “by sharing experiences and technology, India and Mexico can jointly elevate opportunities for our people.”

6. H.E. Mr. Vidal Llerenas Morales, Vice Minister of Industry and Commerce, Ministry of Economy of Mexico underlined the role of technological collaboration in boosting industrial growth and

competitiveness. He noted that partnerships with India's renowned IT industry can complement Mexico's industrial strengths, stating "innovation thrives when our industries work together – turning shared challenges into shared successes."

7. H.E. Ms. Manola Zabalza Aldama, Minister of Economic Development, Mexico City Government, highlighted the role of technology and innovation in reducing poverty in the two countries in the last six years while calling India and Mexico as natural partners.

8. H.E. Ambassador Ulises Canchola Gutierrez, Special Envoy for Emerging Technologies, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Mexico was also present on this occasion. He noted the global impact of the developments in IT and the need for rapid digitisation, particularly economy and value chains.

9. H.E. Ms. Laura Gonzales, Minister of Economic Development, State of Mexico, while welcoming the High Tech Forum, said that both countries share a vision of development driven by technological discussion and innovation, and recognize technology as a driver of economic growth and social well-being. She noted that the recent meeting between President Claudia Sheinbaum and Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the G-7 Summit marks a new stage in bilateral cooperation, especially in the field of semiconductors and artificial intelligence.

10. H.E. Shri Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister of Commerce & Industry of India (via video message) inspired participants to leverage the synergies between India's and Mexico's tech industries. Shri Goyal encouraged businesses of both countries to be ambitious in joint innovation, saying that "there is immense scope for India and Mexico to collaborate in high-tech – by combining our strengths." He noted that India's rise as a global IT leader and Mexico's growing high-tech sector present complementary opportunities. He invited Mexican firms to partner with India's digital initiatives to mutual benefit.

11. Following the inaugural addresses, the forum featured three focused panel discussions delving into critical areas of technology and innovation for both countries: 1. Generative AI: Transforming Competitiveness and Innovation; 2. Building Digital Public Infrastructure for Citizens and 3. The Future of GCCs: From Cost Centers to Innovation Powerhouses. Leading experts from the IT & Tech industries including senior representatives of companies like Cognizant, HCLTech, Bosch, Bimbo, Banpay, Avahi, Ankbyte, Latentview Decisionpoint, Infosys, Magzter, BBVA, etc., and important industry organizations, namely, ANTAD and INA, were part of the panel discussions.

12. The forum opened up new avenues for collaboration between the Indian and Mexican IT and innovation sectors. Both sides identified numerous future opportunities – from joint research projects in emerging technologies, to startup exchanges and innovation incubators, to workforce development programs harnessing each country's talent pool. Participants noted the complementary strengths of India and Mexico: India's large IT services industry and experience with digital public goods, and Mexico's manufacturing base and proximity to North American markets.

13. The 2nd India-Mexico High Tech Forum 2025 concluded on an optimistic note, with all participants reaffirming their commitment to strengthening bilateral relations in technology and innovation. As envisioned by stakeholders in the first edition, the High Tech Forum has become a

permanent platform for advancing joint innovation goals . The success of this year's forum has set a positive tone for the future, further solidifying the strategic partnership between India and Mexico in the digital age.
